4. FIRST AID MEASURES

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Environmental Precautions: Do not allow material to enter streams, sewers, or other waterways. Use for tree micro-injection only as post-bloom application.

Spill or leak procedures: Small Spills – Clean up spills immediately, observing precautions in Section 8. Absorb spill with absorbent material such as pet litter. After removal, flush contaminated area thoroughly with water containing a strong detergent. Sweep up and place in a chemical container. Seal the container and dispose of in accordance with all State and Federal regulations. Large Spills – Keep out of streams and domestic water supplies. Dike area to prevent contamination of local water sources.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Store capsules in an upright position in a closed container. Store in a cool, dry place out of the reach of children. Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal of capsules. Do not reuse micro-injection capsules or bottles. Dispose of in accordance with all State and Federal regulations and according to the disposal directions on the product label.
